context

CEAS ceased to apply to the UK followed by **New Plan** for Immigration (December 2022)

- Increased prison time from 14 years to life for assisting those crossing the English Channel
- Criminal offence to enter UK illegally, now by arrival I.e. on sea territory
- Removals agreement with Albania, lack of deals with the EU
- Increased delays in asylum processing

lgbtgai+ refugees

LGBTQI refugees are still rejected by their families and communities even in the UK. They become **extremely isolated**, without enough social safety nets and opportunities in life. They live at the **margins of society**, often in environments that **expose** them to increased **abuse and violence.** – Micro Rainbows

"After a listening event in June 2023 with 150 asylum seekers living in hotels, a lack of bus travel was identified as a key priority. A campaign to provide asylum seekers with access to free bus travel was ratified at a London Citizens assembly on October 2023 with 300 attendees representing over 200 civil society organisations".

"I have to take a big train and then the tube so for me there's a lot of money. For asylum seekers I feel like we should have some sort of concession because **how else are we going to access support or therapy and community**."

"I take acting classes about 3-4 times a week [...] I get 45 pounds per week from the Home Office and I'm not allowed to work, so I spend [...] all my money on my Oyster. I don't buy food cause I get all my food from the food banks and Olio.


I am not reimbursed for my acting classes since it's not a charity[...] And I need to take acting classes cause I want to get into a drama school."

2. SUPPORT


Spaces for personal and professional networking, alongside with a platform to showcase their work.
